Respiratory devices

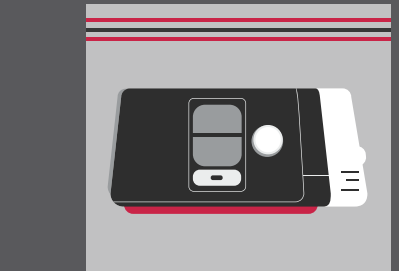
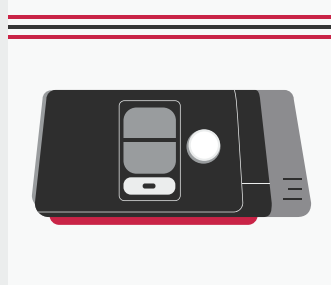
such as CPAP and BiPap machines are permitted in your carry-on bag (or checked baggage).

We recommend placing the main unit in a clear plastic bag (not provided by CATSA).

Tubes and Masks

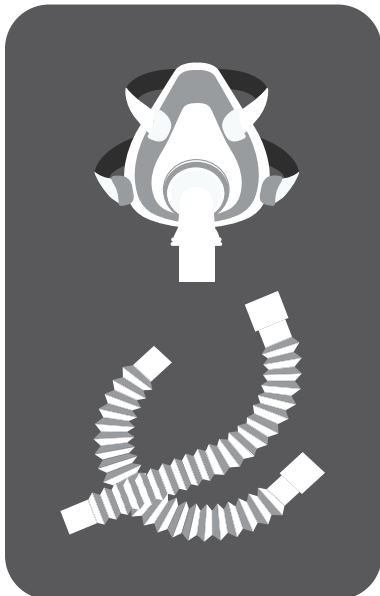
For sanitary reasons, they can stay in your carrying case.

Attachments or parts of the machine that connect to the tubes will not be touched by the screening officer. ▼



Unpack the main unit from its carrying case and place it in a bin at the checkpoint*.

* Unless at CT line, where all electronics can remain in their bags.



Exception to the 100 ml Rule





Distilled water

for respiratory devices is considered a medical necessity and is exempt from 100 ml liquid restrictions.

Distilled water in separate containers must be presented to the screening officer for inspection.
